The book is destined for the university humanities teachers and students and Slavonic studies departments, museums and libraries specialists, and everybody who is interested in the Russian history.



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Chapter 2

(Mikhail B. Sverdlov)

Short Pravda Russkaya

The Short *Pravda Russkaya* (SP) is one of the oldest remaining monuments of the written language of Kievan Rus and its part called "*Pravda Yaroslava*" is apparently the oldest monument of the secular literary language of the Old Russian period. SP is the code of laws of the first half of the eleventh century issued at different times.¹

In the Rus of the ninth and tenth centuries the creation of the hand-written law failed to keep up with the process of statehood development considerably. The marches of the Princes Oleg, Igor, Svyatoslav, and Vladimir in Eastern Europe resulted in the creation of a huge state — from Ladoga to the Middle-Dnieper Region, from Galicia and Volhynia to the Volga and Oka interfluve. Rus was engaged in the active foreign policy at that time and concluded interstate treaties. The Old Russian statehood developed. There was a public authority presented by the dynasty

And this is the law applied to collectors of fines (virnik): a collector of a vira takes 7 buckets of malt for a week, and also a sheep or half a carcass of beef, or two nogatas; and on Wednesday a rezana or cheese, on Friday the same, and bread and millet as much as they can eat; and a collector of a vira (virnik) must be paid 60 grivnas and 10 rezanas and 12 veveritsas, and a grivna at the entry, and during the fast when they are fed with fish they may take 7 rezanas for fish; thus all in all 15 kunas for a week, and bread as much as they can eat; collectors of a vira may collect a vira not longer than a week. This is the resolution of Yaroslav.

Vast Pravda Russkaya

A traditional title — the Vast Pravda Russkaya (VP) — is misleading. In aggregate with another traditional title — the Short Pravda Russkaya (SP) — it leads to the opinion that there was some judicial monument — the Pravda Russkaya which had two versions, a short and a vast version. But it is not the case. VP was the code of laws and the second codification of the hand-written Russian Law. The Old Russian lawyers included into it the laws different in time and origin. SP was among them. Thus, SP and VP are two different monuments of a judicial thought and the Old Russian written language.

The researchers dated the creation of VP differently and with substantial differences in interpretations to the first third of the twelfth century (most of the researchers) through the early thirteenth century (N. L. Duvernoy, S. V. Vedrov, V. O. Kliuchevsky, M. N. Tikhomirov, L. V. Cherepnin, Ya. N. Shchapov and others). The first opinion seems to be correct. VP was issued, probably, during the rule of Grand Prince Vladimir Monomakh in Kiev (1113–1125) or the rule of Mstislav Vladimirovich the Great (1125–1132). Later in the time of political disintegration of Kievan Rus into numerous independent princedoms such all-Russian codification of the hand-written Law was impossible. This code was so good that it was used as the source of secular law till the end of the fifteenth century.¹⁰

VP is written in the excellent literary Old Russian language without dialectisms. At the same time it is a wonderful literary work that has not been appreciated yet. With laconism typical to medieval realism VP gives an account of different life situations in connection with infringement of law, in connection with the relationship of supremacy and subordination, in connection with judicial-investigative procedure and so on. As concerns a literary style judicial regulations are written in different
